The **Weekapaug Inn** sits right on the shore of Quonochontaug Pond, and has Adirondack chairs and a fire pit where they offer after-dinner s'mores and cocktails for restaurant and hotel guests. *25 Spray Rock Road, Westerly. 401-637-7600, WeekapaugInn.com*
